


Figure 1: Religious Influences in Chinese Design

At the same time, they should also pay attention to the aesthetic trends and cultural needs of contemporary society and constantly improve their design level and innovation capabilities. Only in this way can designers better assume the mission of cultural inheritance and innovation of religious elements in design, and contribute to the development of contemporary Chinese design aesthetics.

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
